Being aware of these rights provided to Respondents by operation of law, the undersigned Respondents knowingly and voluntarily waive each and every one of these rights and freely enter into this Joint Stipulation of Facts, Waiver of Hearing before the Missouri Ethics Commission, and Consent Order with Joint Proposed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and agree to abide by the terms of this document.

I.

Based upon the foregoing, the Petitioner and the undersigned Respondents jointly stipulate to the following and request that the Missouri Ethics Commission adopt as its own the Joint Proposed Findings of Fact and the Joint Proposed Conclusions of Law, as follows:

**JOINT PROPOSED FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Missouri Ethics Commission (“the Commission”) is an agency of the State of Missouri established pursuant to Section 105.955, RSMo, in part for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of Chapter 130, RSMo.
2. Respondent Rockwood School District is a political subdivision of the State of Missouri.
3. Respondent Rockwood School District meets the definition of a “person” according to Section 130.011(22), RSMo.
4. Respondent Rockwood School District created and distributed materials relative to Proposition S, a local ballot measure.
5. Respondent Bruce Borchers was the Superintendent of the Rockwood School District during the pertinent time of this complaint.
6. Proposition S was unsuccessful in the April 2, 2013 election.

7. Pursuant to Section 105.961, RSMo, the Commission's staff has investigated a complaint filed with the Commission and reported the investigation's findings to the Commission.

8. Based on the report of the Commission's staff, the Commission determined that there were reasonable grounds to believe that violations of law occurred, and it therefore authorized a hearing in this matter pursuant to Section 105.961.3, RSMo.

9. Respondents Borchers and Rockwood School District published, circulated, and/or distributed the flyers, emails and informational displays, attached hereto as Exhibit A, by displaying them at schools within the district, and emailing them to parents.

10. Rockwood School District paid for the printed matter attached hereto as Exhibit A.

11. The printed matter attached hereto as Exhibit A relates to a ballot measure in the April 2013 election.

12. The flyers and informational materials attached hereto as Exhibit A should have contained a clear and conspicuous statement: "Paid for by Rockwood School District, Bruce Borchers, Superintendent, 111 East North Street, Eureka, MO 63025", but they did not.

#### JOINT PROPOSED CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

13. "Any person publishing, circulating, or distributing any printed matter relative to any candidate for public office or any ballot measure shall on the face of the printed matter identify in a clear and conspicuous manner the person who paid for the printed matter with the words "Paid for by" followed by the proper identification of the sponsor pursuant to this section." § 130.031.8, RSMo.

14. “[P]rinted matter’ shall be defined to include any pamphlet, circular, handbill, sample ballot, advertisement, including advertisements in any newspaper or other periodical, sign, including signs for display on motor vehicles, or other imprinted or lettered material; but ‘printed matter’ is defined to exclude ... any sign personally printed and constructed by an individual without compensation from any other person and displayed at that individual's place of residence or on that individual's personal motor vehicle; any items of personal use given away or sold, such as campaign buttons, pins, pens, pencils, book matches, campaign jewelry, or clothing, which is paid for by a candidate or committee which supports a candidate or supports or opposes a ballot measure and which is obvious in its identification with a specific candidate or committee and is reported as required by this chapter; and any news story, commentary, or editorial printed by a regularly published newspaper or other periodical without charge to a candidate, committee or any other person.” § 130.031.8, RSMo.

15. In regard to any printed matter paid for by a corporation or other business entity, labor organization, or any other organization not defined to be a committee by subdivision (9) of section 130.011 and not organized especially for influencing one or more elections, it shall be sufficient identification to print the name of the entity, the name of the principal officer of the entity, by whatever title known, and the mailing address of the entity, or if the entity has no mailing address, the mailing address of the principal officer. § 130.031.8(3), RSMo.

16. There is probable cause to believe that Respondents Borchers and Rockwood School District violated Section 130.031.8(3), RSMo, by publishing, circulating and distributing the flyers and informational materials attached hereto as Exhibit A without including the proper “paid for by” disclosure.

## II.

Based on the foregoing, the parties hereto mutually agree and stipulate that the following shall constitute the order entered by the Missouri Ethics Commission in this matter. This order will be effective immediately upon the issuance of the Consent Order of the Missouri Ethics Commission without further action by any party:

1. The parties to this Joint Stipulation understand that the Petitioner will maintain this Joint Stipulation as an open and public record of the Missouri Ethics Commission.

2. The Commission shall issue its Consent Order in the form attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

a. Respondents shall comply with all relevant sections of Chapter 130, RSMo.

b. It is the Order of the Missouri Ethics Commission that a letter of reprimand be issued against Respondents, pursuant to Section 105.961.4(4), RSMo.

3. The parties consent to the entry of record and approval of this Joint Stipulation and to the termination of any further proceedings before the Commission based upon the Complaint filed by the Petitioner in the above action.

4. Respondents, together with their heirs, successors, and assigns, do hereby waive, release, acquit and forever discharge the Missouri Ethics Commission and its attorneys of or from any liability, claim, actions, causes of action, fees, costs and expenses, and compensation, including but not limited to, a claim for attorney's fees whatsoever which Respondents or Respondents' attorney may now have or which they may hereafter have, which are based upon or arise out of the above cases.

5. This joint stipulation does not settle, release, waive, or otherwise relieve Respondents from any late filing fees due to the appropriate filing authority, including Petitioner Missouri Ethics Commission. Respondents understand that late filing fees accrue automatically under Section 105.963, RSMo.



On April 2, Rockwood voters will consider **Proposition S**, a \$38.4 million no-tax rate increase bond issue on the ballot. Through Picture Rockwood, a citizen-led community engagement process, priorities for our students were identified.

- **SAFETY:** Provide for safety modifications, such as security cameras, door-locking systems and check-in centers at school entrances.
- **TECHNOLOGY:** Update computers and networks so students are prepared for 21st century learning required by today's and tomorrow's workforce.
- **SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS:** Repair and renovate existing schools to maintain the district's investment in facilities and buildings.

The referendum would not require an increase to the district's current debt service tax rate of 68 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation of real and personal property. A four-sevenths (57.14 percent) majority is necessary for passage on April 2.



### PROPOSITION S: Ballot Language

Shall the Rockwood R-6 School District, St. Louis County, Missouri, issue its general obligation bonds in the amount of \$38.4 Million Dollars (\$38,400,000) for the purposes of: (1) acquiring, constructing, renovating, repairing, improving, furnishing and equipping school sites, buildings and related facilities in the District including but not limited to (a) safety and health measures; (2) technology infrastructure and classroom technology; and (3) maintenance of current facilities by continuing to fund major capital repairs and improvements, resulting in no estimated increase in the debt service property tax levy. If this proposition is approved, the adjusted debt service levy of the District is estimated to remain unchanged at sixty-eight cents (\$0.68) per one hundred dollars assessed valuation of real and personal property.
