Dear Mayor Schneider:

The Missouri Ethics Commission considered the complaint filed against the City of Florissant at its October 2, 2014 meeting. The complaint alleges that the City of Florissant: 1) expended public funds when the mayor issued a news release supporting a local ballot measure to increase the operating tax levy of the Ferguson-Florissant school district; and 2) that the news release failed to include a paid for by disclosure.

From the facts presented, the Commission finds no reasonable grounds exist to support a violation of Chapter 115 or 130, RSMo, and is dismissing the complaint. While you did issue a "Newsletter/News Release" in support of the ballot measure, section 115.646, RSMo, allows a public official to issue a news release regarding a ballot measure.

The news release was disseminated via email and not as a printed document. Therefore, the release did not trigger Section 130.031.8, RSMo requiring a paid for by disclosure.
