FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

This is the Final Decision and Order of the Missouri Ethics Commission following a hearing on a Complaint filed by Petitioner, by and through Counsel, pursuant to §105.961, RSMo, and Chapter 536, RSMo. The hearing was conducted before the following members of the Missouri Ethics Commission: Jim Wright, Jim Tweedy, Jeff Davison, Vernon Dowdy, Louis J. Leonatti, and Dennis Rose.

A closed hearing took place on September 10, 2010 and December 9, 2010 at the offices of the Missouri Ethics Commission at 3411 A Knipp Drive, Jefferson City, Missouri 65109. The Commission was represented by Elizabeth L. Ziegler, Legal Counsel. Respondents Rodney Hubbard and Joy Camp, appeared in person and with counsel.

On September 10, 2010, Petitioner and Respondents entered into a Joint Stipulation of Facts and Law which is incorporated into to this Findings of Fact, Conclusions and Order. The Commission admitted into evidence Petitioner's Exhibits 1 through 32. Having considered all the competent and substantial evidence upon the whole record, the Commission finds as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Missouri Ethics Commission ("the Commission") is an agency of the State of Missouri established pursuant to § 105.955, RSMo, in part for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of Chapter 130, RSMo.
- Rodney Hubbard was an unsuccessful candidate for State Senate, District 5 in the
 August 5, 2008 primary election.
- Hubbard for Senate is a candidate committee registered with Petitioner. On
 March 2, 2009, an amended statement of committee organization was filed converting
 Respondent to a debt service committee. Respondent Joy Camp is the Treasurer of Committee.
- 4. Pursuant to § 130.026, RSMo, the Missouri Ethics Commission is the appropriate officer designated to receive campaign finance reports under Chapter 130 for candidate committees.
- 5. Respondents Hubbard as Candidate, and Camp, as Treasurer, were responsible for filing campaign finance reports for Respondent Committee, pursuant to § 130.041.1 and §130.058, RSMo.
- 6. Pursuant to § 105.959, RSMo, the Commission's staff audited the files of the Committee and reported its findings to the Commission.

Failure to Maintain Accurate and Complete Records

- 7. On October 25, 2009, Respondent Joy Camp was duly served with a subpoena duces tecum for all records and documents relating to Respondent Committee in the possession of the Respondents.
- 8. The documents provided which were subject to the subpoena *duces tecum* were not accurate records and accounts containing all bills, receipts, deposit records, canceled checks and other detailed information necessary to prepare and substantiate any statement or report required to be filed pursuant to this chapter.

Failure to Timely File Campaign Finance Disclosure Reports

- 9. Respondents filed a thirty day after primary disclosure report on October 10, 2008, originally due on September 4, 2008.
- 10. Respondents filed an October 2008 Limited Activity Report, originally due on October 15, 2008, on October 27, 2008.
- 11. Respondents filed an October 2009 Limited Activity Statement, originally due on October 15, 2009, on October 26, 2009.
- 12. Respondents filed Limited Activity Statements for January and April 2009 on April 26, 2009. Both reports were originally due on April 15, 2009.

Improper Filing of Limited Activity Reports for January and April 2009

13. On June 29, 2007, Respondents deposited into the official fund depository a contribution in the amount of \$30,000.00 from Rex A. Sinquefeld. This contribution was reported on the July 2007 Quarterly Disclosure Report.

- 14. On November 25, 2007, Petitioner was informed by Antonio D. French, identified as Campaign Manager for Respondent Committee, that the Committee would soon begin the process of returning contributions which were over the recently reinstated limits of \$650.00.
- 15. On the Amended April 2008 Quarterly Disclosure Report, Respondents reported a refund to Rex Sinquefeld on February 20, 2008 in the amount of \$15,007.00, and a refund in the amount of \$15,000.00 on March 20, 2008.
- 16. On February 20, 2008 check number 1116 from the official fund depository was issued to Joy Camp and contained the signature "Joy Camp". The check was written for \$15,007.00 but cleared the official fund depository for \$1,507.00. On February 21, 2010, there was a 'miscellaneous withdrawal' from the official fund depository in the amount of \$13,500.00.
- 17. On March 20, 2008, check number 1125 was issued from the official fund depository in the amount of \$15,000.00.
- 18. On October 23, 2008, \$15,000.00 was credited to the official fund depository for reimbursement of funds issued on February 20, 2008. The "General Ledger Debit" stated, "Refund for cashiers [check] on 2/20/08 for \$15,000.00, check was destroyed. Serial # on [check] is 528233607- purchased @ Lindell." Prior to February 20, 2008, the account balance in the official fund depository was \$19.53.
- 19. Respondents failed to report the following expenditures on a timely filed January or April 2009 Campaign Finance Disclosure report, following the credit of \$15,000.00 which occurred as follows:

- 21. Respondents failed to report the following additional expenditures on a timely filed Campaign Finance Disclosure report and failed to maintain and make available records to support the expenditures as follows:

Respondents issued three checks totaling \$14,128.00 from the official fund depository, payable to cash in excess of \$50.00, and signed by Respondent Camp and endorsed by Respondent Camp, as detailed in paragraph 49. Respondents failed to report the purpose of the transactions as required by 130.041.1(4)(d), RSMo.

- 51. Cash was withdrawn fifty-two times from the committee's official fund depository through Automatic Transaction Machines (ATM) transactions from the depository, totaling \$12,849.94 as detailed in paragraph 49. Respondents failed to report the purpose of the transactions as required by 130.041.1(4)(d), RSMo.
- 52. Cash was withdrawn from the committee's official fund depository through a "counter withdrawal" four times for a total of \$3,044.00 as detailed in paragraph 49. On July 31, 2008, \$350.00 was received from a deposit of \$600.00. Respondents failed to report the purpose of the transactions as required by 130.041.1(4)(d), RSMo.
- 53. Cash withdrawals and expenditures in 2007 and 2008 were in excess of the lesser of \$5,000.00 or ten percent of all expenditures made by the committee during those calendar years.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Failure to Maintain Accurate and Complete Records

- 1. Section 130.034, RSMo provides as follows concerning the use of contributions by a committee established under Chapter 130 as follows:
 - 1. Contributions as defined in section 130.011, received by any committee shall not be converted to any personal use.
 - 2. Contributions may be used for any purpose allowed by law including, but not limited to:
 - (1) Any ordinary expenses incurred relating to a campaign;
 - (2) Any ordinary and necessary expenses incurred in connection with the duties of a holder of elective office;
 - (3) Any expenses associated with the duties of candidacy or of elective office pertaining to the entertaining of or providing social courtesies to constituents, professional associations, or other holders of elective office;

- (4) The return of any contribution to the person who made the contribution to the candidate or holder of elective office;
- (5) To contribute to a political organization or candidate committee as allowed by law;
- (6) To establish a new committee as defined by this chapter;
- (7) To make an unconditional gift which is fully vested to any charitable, fraternal or civic organizations or other associations formed to provide for some good in the order of benevolence, if such candidate, former candidate or holder of elective office or such person's immediate family gain no direct financial benefit from the unconditional gift;
- (8) Except when such candidate, former candidate or holder of elective office dies while the committee remains in existence, the committee may make an unconditional gift to a fund established for the benefit of the spouse and children of the candidate, former candidate or holder of elective office. The provisions of this subdivision shall expire October 1, 1997.
- 2. §130.036. 1, RSMo, requires a candidate, treasurer or deputy treasurer to maintain accurate and records of accounts and records of a committee to prepare and substantiate a campaign finance report filed by the Committee as follows:

The candidate, treasurer or deputy treasurer of a committee shall maintain accurate records and accounts on a current basis. The records and accounts shall be maintained in accordance with accepted normal bookkeeping procedures and shall contain the bills, receipts, deposit records, canceled checks and other detailed information necessary to prepare and substantiate any statement or report required to be filed pursuant to this chapter...

3. According to §130.036. 8, RSMo, in pertinent part:

All records and accounts of receipts and expenditures shall be preserved for at least three years after the date of the election to which the records pertain. Records and accounts regarding supplemental disclosure reports or reports not required pursuant to an election shall be preserved for at least three years after the date of the report to which the records pertain. Such records shall be available for inspection by the campaign finance review board and its duly authorized representatives.

4. There is probable cause the Respondents violated §130.036. 1., RSMo by failing to maintain accurate records and accounts for Respondent Committee, including the bills, receipts, deposit records, canceled checks and other detailed information necessary to prepare and substantiate any statement or report required to be filed pursuant to this chapter, and that Respondents did so knowingly.

Failure to Timely File Campaign Finance Disclosure Reports

5. §130.046. 1, RSMo provides:

The disclosure reports required by section 130.041 for all committees shall be filed at the following times and for the following periods:

. . .

- (2) Not later than the thirtieth day after an election for a period closing on the twenty-fifth day after the election, if the committee has made any contribution or expenditure either in support of or opposition to any candidate or ballot measure; except that, a successful candidate who takes office prior to the twenty-fifth day after the election shall have complied with the report requirement of this subdivision if a disclosure report is filed by such candidate and any candidate committee under the candidate's control before such candidate takes office, and such report shall be for the period closing on the day before taking office;
- 6. There is probable cause that Respondents have violated §130.046. 1, RSMo by failing to file timely a thirty day after election report, originally due on September 4, 2008, on October 10, 2008, an October 2008 Limited Activity Report, originally due on October 15, 2008, on October 27, 2008, Limited Activity Statements for January and April 2009 on April 26, 2009, both reports originally due on April 15, 2009, and an October 2009 Limited Activity Statement, originally due on October 15, 2009, on October 26, 2009, and that Respondents did so knowingly.

7. §130.046. 5(2), RSMo provides when a statement of limited activity can be file by a committee as follows:

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this chapter to the contrary:

- (2) No disclosure report needs to be filed for any reporting period if during that reporting period the committee has neither received contributions aggregating more than five hundred dollars nor made expenditure aggregating more than five hundred dollars and has not received contributions aggregating more than three hundred dollars from any single contributor and if the committee's treasurer files a statement with the appropriate officer that the committee has not exceeded the identified thresholds in the reporting period.
- 8. There is probable cause that Respondents have violated §130.046.5(2), RSMo when Respondents filed a January and April 2009 Limited Activity Statement when Respondents were required to file a full campaign finance disclosure report, and that Respondents did so knowingly.

Failure to Accurately Report Contributions Received

9. According to § 130.041.1(3)(a), RSMo:

Except as provided in subsection 5 of section 130.016, the candidate, if applicable, treasurer or deputy treasurer of every committee which is required to file a statement of organization, shall file a legibly printed or typed disclosure report of receipts and expenditures. The reports shall be filed with the appropriate officer designated in section 130.026 at the times and for the periods prescribed in section 130.046. Except as provided in sections 130.049 and 130.050, each report shall set forth:

- (3) Receipts for the period, including:
 - (a) Total amount of all monetary contributions received which can be identified in the committee's records by name and address of each contributor. In addition, the candidate committee shall make a reasonable effort to obtain and report the employer, or occupation if self-employed or notation of retirement, of each person from whom the committee received one or more contributions which in the aggregate total in excess of one hundred dollars and shall make a reasonable effort to obtain and report a description of any contractual

relationship over five hundred dollars between the contributor and the state if the candidate is seeking election to a state office or between the contributor and any political subdivision of the state if the candidate is seeking election to another political subdivision of the state;

10. According to §130.021.4. (1), RSMo:

Every committee shall have a single official fund depository within this state which shall be a federally or state-chartered bank, a federally or state-chartered savings and loan association, or a federally or state-chartered credit union in which the committee shall open and thereafter maintain at least one official depository account in its own name... All contributions which the committee receives in money, checks and other negotiable instruments shall be deposited in a committee's official depository account. Contributions shall not be accepted and expenditures shall not be made by a committee except by or through an official depository account and the committee treasurer, deputy treasurer or candidate. ...

11. According to §130.031.1, RSMo:

No contribution of cash in an amount of more than one hundred dollars shall be made by or accepted from any single contributor for any election by a continuing committee, a campaign committee, a political party committee, an exploratory committee or a candidate committee.

12. There is probable cause that Respondents have violated §130.041.1(3)(a), RSMo by failing to report contributions totaling \$85,850.46, including the name, address, employer or occupation of the contributor which were deposited into the official fund depository, and by reporting \$16,280.00 in contributions which were not deposited into the official fund depository.

Failure to Accurately Report Expenditures

13. §130.041. 1(4)(d), RSMo provides:

§130.041. 1. Except as provided in subsection 5 of section 130.016, the candidate, if applicable, treasurer or deputy treasurer of every committee which is required to file a statement of organization, shall file a legibly printed or typed disclosure report of receipts and expenditures. The reports shall be filed with the appropriate officer designated in section 130.026 at the times and for the periods prescribed in section 130.046. Except as provided in sections 130.049 and 130.050, each report shall set forth:

(4) Expenditures for the period, including:

. . .

- (d) The full name and mailing address of each person to whom an expenditure of money or any other thing of value in the amount of more than one hundred dollars has been made, contracted for or incurred, together with the date, amount and purpose of each expenditure.
- 14. §130.021.4. (1), RSMo provides that all expenditures shall be made by or through an official fund depository and committee treasurer or candidate.

15. According to § 130.031.2, RSMo:

Except for expenditures from a petty cash fund which is established and maintained by withdrawals of funds from the committee's depository account and with records maintained pursuant to the record-keeping requirements of section 130.036 to account for expenditures made from petty cash, each expenditure of more than fifty dollars, except an in-kind expenditure, shall be made by check drawn on the committee's depository and signed by the committee treasurer, deputy treasurer or candidate. A single expenditure from a petty cash fund shall not exceed fifty dollars, and the aggregate of all expenditures from a petty cash fund during a calendar year shall not exceed the lesser of five thousand dollars or ten percent of all expenditures made by the committee during that calendar year. A check made payable to "cash" shall not be made except to replenish a petty cash fund.

- 16. §130.031.3, RSMo provides that no expenditure shall be made or incurred, directly or indirectly, in a fictitious name, in the name of another person, or by or through another person in such a manner as to conceal the identity of the actual source of the contribution or the actual recipient and purpose of the expenditure.
- 17. There is probable cause to believe that Respondents violated §130.041. 1(4)(d), RSMo by failing to report \$129,351.88 in expenditures, including the name and address of each to whom the expenditure was made or incurred from the official fund depository as listed in paragraphs 50 and 51, and by reporting \$45,461.00 in expenditures which were not expended from the official fund depository, and by failing to accurately report expenditures in the amount of \$7,290.32 and that Respondents did so knowingly.

Cash Contributions

18. According to §130.031.1, RSMo:

No contribution of cash in an amount of more than one hundred dollars shall be made by or accepted from any single contributor for any election by a continuing committee, a campaign committee, a political party committee, an exploratory committee or a candidate committee.

- 19. §130.041. 1 (3), RSMo, requires that the candidate committee report the name and mailing address, and shall make a reasonable effort to obtain and report the employer, or occupation if self-employed or notation of retirement, of each person from whom the committee received one or more contributions which in the aggregate total in excess of one hundred dollars.
- 20. There is probable cause to believe that Respondents violated §130.031.1, RSMo and §130.041.1 (3), RSMo by receiving cash contributions into the official fund depository in excess of \$100.00 and by failing to report contributions which were \$100.00 or less from a single contributor, in the amount of the cash deposits, and that Respondents did so knowingly.

Cash Expenditures

21. According to § 130.031.2, RSMo:

Except for expenditures from a petty cash fund which is established and maintained by withdrawals of funds from the committee's depository account and with records maintained pursuant to the record-keeping requirements of section 130.036 to account for expenditures made from petty cash, each expenditure of more than fifty dollars, except an in-kind expenditure, shall be made by check drawn on the committee's depository and signed by the committee treasurer, deputy treasurer or candidate. A single expenditure from a petty cash fund shall not exceed fifty dollars, and the aggregate of all expenditures from a petty cash fund during a calendar year shall not exceed the lesser of five thousand dollars or ten percent of all expenditures made by the committee during that calendar year. A check made payable to "cash" shall not be made except to replenish a petty cash fund.

22. There is probable cause to believe that Respondents Rodney Hubbard, Joy Camp and Hubbard for Senate §130.031.2, RSMo by issuing three checks to cash, totaling \$14,128.00 from the official fund depository, and by withdrawing cash totaling \$16,243.94 from the official fund depository, which exceeded \$50 for single transactions, and the aggregate which exceeded 10% of all expenditures made by the committee during that calendar year, and that Respondents did so knowingly.

Consulting Services

23. According to §130.041. 4, RSMo:

The words "consulting or consulting services, fees, or expenses", or similar words, shall not be used to describe the purpose of a payment as required in this section. The reporting of any payment to such an independent contractor shall be on a form supplied by the appropriate officer, established by the ethics commission and shall include identification of the specific service or services provided including, but not limited to, public opinion polling, research on issues or opposition background, print or broadcast media production, print or broadcast media purchase, computer programming or data entry, direct mail production, postage, rent, utilities, phone solicitation, or fund raising, and the dollar amount prorated for each service.

24. There is probable cause the Respondents violated §130.041.4, RSMo by failing to report \$3,000.00, and improperly reporting \$16,800.00 in expenditures to an independent contractor as "campaign consultant" and "campaign manager" and by failing to include identification of the specific service or services provided, and that Respondents did so knowingly.

ORDER

The Commission finds probable cause that Respondents Rodney Hubbard, Joy Camp and

Hubbard for Senate knowingly violated, and have knowingly violated §130.036.1, RSMo,

§130.046.1, RSMo, §130.046.5(2), RSMo, §130.041.1(3)(a), RSMo, §130.041.1(4)(d), RSMo,

§130.031.1 RSMo, §130.041.1(3), RSMo, §130.031.2, RSMo and §130.041.4, RSMo.

It is the order of the Missouri Ethics Commission that a fee is imposed against the

Respondents Rodney Hubbard, Joy Camp and Hubbard for Senate in the amount of \$322,000

pursuant to §105.961.4(6) RSMo. However, if either Respondent pays \$32,200 of that fee within

ninety (90) days after the date of the Order, the remainder of the fee will be stayed for two years,

subject to the provisions below.

If Respondents Rodney Hubbard, Joy Camp or Hubbard for Senate_have not committed

any further violations of the campaign finance disclosure laws pursuant to Chapter 130, RSMo

2000, during the two year stay then Respondents will not be required to pay the balance of this

fee.

If, however, either Respondent Rodney Hubbard, Joy Camp or Hubbard for Senate is

found to have violated the campaign finance laws pursuant to Chapter 130, RSMo 2000, during

this two year stay, Respondents Rodney Hubbard, Joy Camp and Hubbard for Senate will be

required to pay the balance of the fee as originally imposed by the Commission. The amount of

the balance will be due immediately upon final adjudication finding probable cause of such a

violation.
