Final Action: MEC No. 22-0079-I, Megan Green, Megan Green for St. Louis

The Missouri Ethics Commission took final consideration of the complaint filed against Megan Green and Megan Green for St. Louis at its January 24, 2023, meeting.

The complaint filed with the Commission alleged Megan Green and Megan Green for St. Louis failed to report expenditures associated with a birthday party/campaign fundraising event held July 25, 2022, which was advertised on social media accounts and included a link to her ActBlue donation page. The investigation showed that all contributions either received at the event or through ActBlue were properly reported on Megan Green for St. Louis's 8-Day Before St. Louis City 9-13-22 Primary Election report. There were no expenditures for this event that were not reported and there was no in-kind contribution from the venue which does not charge for the use of space.

The complaint also alleged that she failed to report rent payments and/or subsidization of rent payments as in-kind contributions which exceed the contribution limits in St. Louis City. This allegation related to campaign headquarters located at 4462 Maryland Avenue formally opened on July 7, 2022 and reported on campaign finance reports as \$1,539.00 monthly. The investigation showed that the monthly rent paid for this newly acquired property was not subsidized and there was no in-kind contribution to the committee based upon the fair market value of the lease.

From the facts presented, the Commission found no reasonable grounds exist to support a violation of Chapter 130, RSMo, or St. Louis City ordinance and dismissed the complaint.
