

Requirements

- Any person publishing, circulating, or distributing campaign material about candidates for public office or ballot measures in Missouri must comply with 'paid for by' disclosure requirements.
- Any pamphlets circular, handbill, sample ballot, advertisement, sign, or other imprinted or lettered material that is relative to candidates or ballot measures must contain the proper 'paid for by' disclaimer.
- Informational materials about candidates or ballot measures (not necessarily in support or opposition) must contain the proper 'paid for by' disclaimer.

Violation:

Violations of Chapter 130 are within the Missouri Ethics Commission's jurisdiction and, in the event a complaint is filed, may result in an enforcement action.

In addition, the law specifically defines the refusal to provide the information required by law or to purposely provide false, misleading, or incomplete information as a violation of Chapter 130.



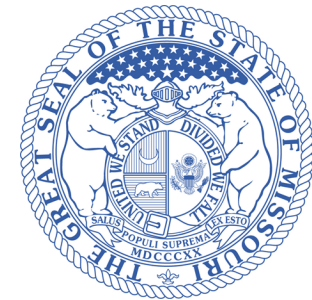

What is **excluded** from the 'paid for by' disclaimer requirements?

- Items of personal use given away or sold **that are**
 - Paid for by a candidate or committee supporting or opposing candidates or ballot measures **and are**
 - Obvious in its identification with a specific candidate or committee **and**
 - The cost of which is reported on campaign finance reports as required by law.

- A news story, commentary or editorial printed by a regularly published newspaper or other periodical without charge to a candidate, committee or any other person.

- A sign personally printed and constructed by an individual, without compensation from any other person, **and** is displayed at that individual's place of residence or on their personal motor vehicle.

MEC Tip:
Place 'paid for by' disclosures on website pages relative to a candidate or ballot measure to ensure compliance with disclosure requirements in Chapter 130, RSMo.

Who paid for the campaign material?	Required Sponsor Information (following the words 'Paid for by')
Candidate from personal funds (only if no committee exists) § 130.031.8(1), RSMo	First and Last name by which candidate is known Example: Paid for by Jane Doe
Committee § 130.031.8(2), RSMo	Name of the committee as required to be registered and the name and title of the committee treasurer who was serving when the printed matter was paid for Example: Paid for by Committee to Elect Jane Doe, John Smith, Treasurer
Corporation, Business, Labor Organization, or other group that does not meet requirements to form a committee § 130.031.8(3), RSMo	Name of the entity, the name of the principal officer of the entity, by whatever title known, and the mailing address of the entity, or if the entity has no mailing address, the mailing address of the principal officer Example: Paid for by Rock Corporation, John Doe, Chief Financial Officer, 888 Main Street, Jefferson City, MO 65109
Individual § 130.031.8(4), RSMo	Name of the individual(s) and the respective mailing address(es) Example: Paid for by Jane Smith, 888 Main Street, Jefferson City, MO 65109 If more than five individuals pay for printed matter, print the words "For a list of other sponsors contact:" followed by the name and address of one individual responsible for causing the matter to be printed, and who will maintain a record of the names and amounts paid by other individuals. Example: Paid for by: For a list of sponsors, contact: John Doe, 8525 South Main, Jefferson City, MO 65101
<i>"Paid for by" statement must use full name of person and/or entity. Use of abbreviations or acronyms, including for committee names, is prohibited.</i>	

Federal disclosure requirements apply when:

- Printing or broadcasting about federal candidates; **and**
- Broadcasting information about any candidate through radio or television.
