The Commission approved the following Joint Stipulations of Facts, Conclusion of Law, Waiver of Hearing before the Missouri Ethics Commission, and issued a Consent Order in the following cases:

09E231 City of University City

The Commission entered a Consent Order with Findings of Fact and Conclusion of Law (“Joint Stipulation”) finding probable cause that Respondent City of University City violated §130.031.8, RSMo, as stated in the Joint Stipulation.

It is the order of the Missouri Ethics Commission that a letter of concern be issued to the City of University City pursuant to §105.961.4(4), RSMo.

09A273 Patrick Lewis

The Commission entered a Consent Order with Findings of Fact and Conclusion of Law (“Joint Stipulation”) finding probable cause that Respondent Patrick Lewis and Committee to Elect Patrick Lewis State Representative violated §130.041.1(8), RSMo, §130.011(9), RSMo and §130.046.7, RSMo, as stated in the Joint Stipulation.

It is order of the Missouri Ethics Commission that a fee is imposed against the Respondents Patrick Lewis and Elect Patrick Lewis State Representative in the amount of \$1,000.00 pursuant to §105.961.4(6) RSMo. However, if Respondents Patrick Lewis and Elect Patrick Lewis State Representative pay \$100.00 of that fee upon execution of this document, the remainder of the fee will be stayed for two years, subject to the provisions below. The fee will be paid by check or money order made payable to the Missouri Ethics Commission and sent to the Missouri Ethics Commission. If Respondents Patrick Lewis and Elect Patrick Lewis State Representative have not committed any further violations of the campaign finance disclosure laws pursuant to Chapter 130, RSMo, during the two year stay, then the Respondents will not be required to pay the remainder of the fee. If, however, either Respondent is found to have violated the campaign finance laws pursuant to Chapter 130, RSMo, during this two year stay, Respondents will be

required to pay the remainder of the fee as originally imposed by the Commission. The fee will be due immediately upon final adjudication finding probable cause of such a violation.
