Campaign Finance cont.

Tweedy were elected as the Commission chair and vice chair, respectively. On March 25, 2010, Dennis Rose, Democrat, from the 1st Cong. District, was appointed to the <u>Commission</u>.

Campaign Finance

April Qtly Reports Due April 15th Report all activity from the day after the committee's last report through March 31st. It must be postmarked by Apr 14th; if electronically filing, the filing should be completed by 5 pm on Apr 15th (Section 130.046.8, RSMo).

Committees who filed an 8 Day Before Election Report (for Apr 6), must still file an Apr Qtly Report! (Section 130.046.3, RSMo)

30 Day After Election Report Due May 6th Committees participating in Apr 6th election, must file. Report all activity from the date after the committee's last full disclosure report through May 1st. (Section 130.046.4,6,RSMo)

Unsuccessful Candidates and Campaign Committees You must terminate the committee within 30 days after the election or upon satisfying any outstanding debt! If a candidate committee's debt > \$ on hand, the committee may be converted to a debt service committee. Debt service committees can *only be used* to repay the committee's debt. (Section 130.011(9), RSMo)

Statement of Committee Organization *Check to make sure it is complete!* A new <u>Statement</u> must include the bank's name, address, account name (not type), and account #. For candidate committees, remember to complete lines 16 and line 18.

Committee Registration Deadline Register no later than 20 days from forming a committee and no later than 30 days before the election (except for continuing committees, which must be formed no later than 60 days before). To register, complete a Statement of Committee Organization. Deadline for the August 3^{rd} primary election: continuing comm's – June 4^{th} ; all other – July 4^{th} .

Committee Fundraising Activities Our website lists <u>A Guide for Candidate Fundraising Activities in Missouri</u> that will inform you of the proper guidelines of holding a fundraiser.

It shall be a violation of this chapter for any committee to offer chances to win prizes or money to persons to encourage such persons to endorse, send election material by mail, deliver election material in person or contact persons at their homes; except that, the provisions of this subsection shall not be construed to prohibit hiring and paying a campaign staff. (Section 130.031.12) Be sure to consult an attorney, the state constitution, and state laws before using gaming as a campaign fund raiser. The Attorney General's website has information pertaining to <u>gambling</u>, lotteries and <u>raffles</u>.

Complaints

Is there a time frame where the Commission cannot accept a complaint related to a candidate? (Section 130.054, RSMo.) Yes, the Commission cannot accept a complaint alleging misconduct on the part of a candidate for public office, other than an allegation of failure to file timely and accurately, a Personal Financial Disclosure statement or campaign finance disclosure reports, within 60 days before the primary election until after the general election. The Commission may not accept a complaint filed against a candidate or candidate committee within 15 days prior to the primary or general election in which the candidate is running for office.
