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## 5 tips for annual personal financial disclosure (PFD) filers

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## Tip #1: Mark your calendar.

To be considered timely filed, most annual filers must submit their PFD by **Thursday**, **May 1**, **2025**. The Commission assesses a late filing fee of \$10 per day for each day the PFD is late. After 30 days, the fee can increase to \$100 per day, up to \$6,000. Additional penalties are set out in § 105.492, RSMo.

## Tip #2: Know whether you're required to file.

Each January, the MEC notifies individuals who have been listed by their political subdivision as a required annual PFD filer. You may also receive notification from your political subdivision.

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## Tip #3: File electronically.

Electronic filing can help you efficiently file your PFD directly with the MEC. In the event you need to file subsequent PFDs, you may copy forward and edit previously electronically-entered information. Click here to login to the PFD electronic filing system. Click here to request a PFD electronic filing account. If you choose to mail your PFD, it must be postmarked no later than April 30, 2025. You can also send a copy to our office via email (pfdonline@mec.mo.gov) or fax (573-526-4506).

## Tip #4: Personal financial disclosure and campaign finance disclosure are different.

PFDs and campaign finance reports are both filed electronically with the MEC. However, these are separate electronic filing systems with separate sets of login credentials. Your PFD MECID will begin with the letter F. Your campaign finance MECID will begin with the letter C or A.

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## Missouri's lobbyist gift ban: A guide for public officials and employees

#### What is the lobbyist gift ban?

The Missouri Constitution prohibits members and employees of the General Assembly from receiving gifts from paid lobbyists or lobbyist principals. Executive Order 18-10 also prohibits lobbyist gifts to the executive branch of state government. These provisions do not prevent elected local government officials, their families, and their staff from receiving lobbyist gifts. However, some political subdivisions may have their own policies regarding lobbyist gifts. Consult local ordinances to learn more about your requirements.

## What happens if I receive a lobbyist gift?

Some groups may drop off items at public offices. Be wary of such unsolicited gifts, as they may come from a lobbyist or lobbyist principal.

Your agency or political subdivision may have specific procedures for surrendering unsolicited gifts. Consult with your council for detailed internal policies and procedures.

You will receive an email each month if a lobbyist has reported an expenditure to you, your staff, or your family on their monthly expenditure report. Please contact the lobbyist directly if you feel the report is in error. Lobbyists may amend their monthly expenditure reports.

No contribution or expenditure of public funds can be made by an officer, employee, or agent of a county, city, township of a township organization county, school district or charter school to advocate, support, or oppose any ballot measure or candidate for public office. This does not prohibit public officials from making public appearances, issuing press releases, or issuing information-only materials about a ballot measure. See § 115.646, RSMo, for more information. Remember, printed materials relative to a ballot measure must include a proper "paid for by" disclaimer. See our <u>Paid for By Information Sheet</u> for further details.
